Formatting

Posters should be printed with **horizontal orientation** at **48" width and 36" height**. There is no particular design or layout that we are requiring. We will provide an easel, binder clips, and a hard board to which you can clip your poster. If your abstract is accepted, please plan to arrive at the venue no later than 4:30pm on Friday, February 28 to set up.
